2025 Legislative Priorities for Iowa's tourism industry:

- Promote Tourism Through User-Funded Enhancements: Tourism Improvement Districts (TIDs) allow for a local mechanism for funding tourism initiatives
- Maintain Consistent Tourism Funding: funding for projects such as Regional Sports Authority Districts, Destination Iowa, CAT, Meet in Iowa, Iowa Tourism Office (IEDA)
- Maintain Iowa's Summer Tourism Season: protect August 23 as the earliest school start date
- Fund the Major Tourism Attraction Fund
