Economic Driver


Gaming significantly boosts lowa's economy by generating substantial tax revenues and supporting local businesses.

Gaming contributes funds essential to state and local government budgets, supporting public services and infrastructure.



Contribution to Iowa's Economy

In calendar year 2024, Iowa casinos provided a statewide economic impact of our member casinos \$1,245,391, 704

Employ more than 6,800 individuals (mainly lowa residents)

89.88% of all spending by the casinos was to lowa based vendors. If items that are not available in lowa such as slot machines and related products are excluded, the spend with lowa vendors is 96.22%.



Support for Communities and Charitable Initiatives

Philanthropic Engagement

Each of the 19 commercial casinos in 15 lowa counties share its license with a Qualified Sponsoring Organization or operate as a nonprofit entity. These nonprofit license holders receive a particular portion of their respective casino's gaming revenue and annually reinvest in numerous charitable and civic needs.

The County Endowment Fund Program distributes a percentage of the state's gaming tax revenue to qualified community foundations in the 84 lowa counties that do not hold a state-issued gaming license. Each county's community foundation distributes 75% of those funds to charitable projects within their counties; the remaining 25% is placed in a permanent endowment fund. The endowment fund is intended to attract other donations and provide a source of permanent funding for charitable projects within the county.
